A Moment With The Minister 3

Subah's tourism industry is one of the major contributors to the State's economy, which is rapidly developing at a rate that distinguishes it as a force to be reckoned with. At the helm is the newly-appointed Minister of Tourism, Culture and Environment, Datuk Masidi Manjun, who aims to spearhead Sabah's tourism efforts with fierce determination. Datuk Masidi hails from Ranau and has long been in service to the State. Prior to becoming the Minister of Tourism, Culture and Environment, he served as the Minister of Youth and Sports from 2004 to 2007.

At the recent 'Afternoon With The Minister' a session with the tourism players, Datuk Masidi shared his hopes, aspirations and directions for the industry. He expressed that the key to Sabah's tourism industry's continuous success is to uphold the quality of goods and services while striving for improvement. "We must not rest on our laurels. There must be continuous effort to be better in all we do," he said. The Minister cited the example of how the current expansion development works of the Kota Kinabalu International Airport (KKIA) has curtailed charter flights into Sabah, hence affecting arrivals into the State. However, he stressed that tourist target arrivals are mere numbers and believed in the adage that "quality is more important than quantity." He further emphasized on the importance of providing quality service in order to attract quality tourists, hence making Sabah a world-class destination.

In our drive to bring the tourism industry to the forefront, Datuk Masidi reminded that tourism has the capacity to contribute towards the alleviation of poverty for the rural community. "Tourism has created many jobs, both directly and indirectly. It is a vehicle and instrument to elevate the income of rural Sabah," he

said, citing examples such as homestay programmes. One of the strategies is to identify scenic routes and districts which make

ideal locations for such homestay programmes. Such developments not only help the local community but attract tourists to enjoy Sabah's natural surroundings while experiencing our culture and warm hospitality. Another vital effort in the pipeline is the building of infrastructures to facilitate the expansion of the tourism industry to rural Sabah. "These basic amenities include restaurants and eateries as well as toilets, particularly along the main trunk roads from Kota Kinabalu to Sandakan, Kota Kinabalu to Tenom and Kota Kinabalu to Sindumin – the last being an important and major access for our visitors from Brunei," he said. He added that maintenance and cleanliness are top priorities. Datuk Masidi also addressed the need for conserving the environment, an effort that must begin with the cleaning up of our rivers. "It is a sad sight to see our beautiful rivers plagued with rubbish. Not only is it an eyesore, but a threat to our health and environment...We must step up and clean our rivers before it is too late," he said. The Minister concluded that maintaining high quality standards remain the main focus of the industry. With concerted efforts, a clear vision and a leader of great abilities to pave the way, Sabah's tourism industry is set for greater heights.

Kundasang War Memorial





he Kundasang War Memorial was established as a tribute to the brave 2,428 Australians and British POWs who died in Sandakan, Ranau or on the infamous Sandakan Death Marches.

The beautiful memorial was initiated by Major G.S. 'Toby' Carter, New а Zealander who served in the Royal Australian Engineers and organised native resistance in the Kelabit Highlands of Sarawak during the War. He was so moved by the atrocities of the Death March that he passionately lobbied for the construction of the memorial. His efforts paid off in 1962 when the Government approved the National Park Bill and the establishment of the Kundasang War Memorial. However, over the years, the memorial suffered a series of vandalism and maintenance was poor. It underwent a major restoration process in the late 2004.

The English Garden truly reminds you of a sunny and bright summer's day! Like a traditional English garden, it is filled with rose bushes, leaving a light rosy scent lingering in the air. The Borneo Garden showcases a treasure of orchids, endemic to Borneo. A special honour is given to the plant that served as staple food during the War - the tapioca. 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Revealing Ranau

G rowing up in Kota Kinabalu means a childhood filled with road trips. Until today, my all-time favourite would be weekend getaways to Kundasang, Ranau. I love the milder temperatures, rolling hills and valleys and, of course, front row seats to Mount Kinabalu! Ranau is only 108 km from Kota Kinabalu, which translates to a leisurely 2-hour drive. The mere mention of Ranau conjures up thoughts of Kinabalu National Park and the majestic peak of Mt Kinabalu. However, not many people realize Ranau is teeming with treasures, awaiting to be unravelled.

Poring Hot Springs

After a challenging trek up and down Mt Kinabalu, soothe your aching muscles at the Poring Hot Springs, located 39 km from Kinabalu Park headquarters. Many swear by the skin-curative properties of a hot sulphur bath. A must-do when in Poring is to go on a scenic trek on its canopy walk. Simply breathtaking! Also within Poring is the beautiful Kipungit Waterfall, just a 20-minute walk from the hot springs. If you are lucky, you might even catch

Daily Kundasang Market (Tamu)

Ranau sits in the shadow of Mt Kinabalu, and with its fertile soil and cool climate, this area is ideal for growing a variety of vegetables, fruits and flowers. When in Kundasang, a must-stop is the famous open-air market where you can find a large selection of fresh vegetables. The market is a kaleidoscope of colours including bright red tomatoes, rows of fresh green cabbages and broccoli and brown mushrooms. Check out other local produce such as honey and rice wine (tapai or lihing) and freshly cut flowers. On the other side of the road are rows of fruit stalls selling rambutans, bananas, buah salak and sometimes even fresh strawberries.

Kinabalu Park

Kinabalu Park is located 1,585 metres above sea level and is Malaysia's first World Heritage Site, joining the ranks of sites such as the Great Barrier Reef in Australia and the Grand Canyon National Park in the USA. It has been designated as a Centre of Plant Diversity for Southeast Asia and is exceptionally rich in species with examples of flora from the Himalayas, China, Australia, Malaysia, as well as pan-tropical flora. The Park is a great place for a getaway whether for day trips or week-long stays to explore the rare and endless eco-treasures found within. There are plenty of accommodation options to suit every budget. This is also where your climb up Mt Kinabalu begins. One of Mt Kinabalu's signature residents is the Nepenthes rajah, the largest pitcher plant found in Sabah. Rhododendrons and exotic orchids also grow in abundance. In fact, the Rhododendron ericoides is found nowhere else in the world. (Contact Sabah Parks at 088-889098)

Kundasang War Memorial

The Kundasang War Memorial, established in 1962, was the first memorial to remember all the Australian and British prisoners of war (POWs) who died in Sandakan and the death marches to Ranau, as well as the people of then North Borneo who risked their lives (some were tortured to death) to help the POWs. The Kundasang War Memorial, which is located at the foot of Mt Kinabalu, has four gardens – the Australian Garden, the English Garden, the Borneo Garden and the Contemplation Garden and Pool – to represent the various nationalities. Mt Kinabalu Golf Course

Tee off to breathtaking views of the mountain at Sabah's highest golf course. Designed by Graham Muir Graves, many golfers agree that this 18-hole course is both physically and mentally challenging with its ever-present winds, steep slopes and surrounding mists. With occasional thick fogs, some even say it feels like you're playing in the clouds! One of its notable holes is the 14th (par 3, 142 metres), which features a gushing river at the bottom of a deep ravine. It is a true test of skill once you get here: you will need an accurate shot from the elevated tee across the Mesilau East River to land on the green perched on the edge of a cliff. ne laca Murut Vedding Celebration

he Tagal Murut are the most numerous and widespread of Sabah's Murutic people, the third largest community in Sabah. They are found in the interior of southeastern areas of Sabah, in the Sapulut to Pensiangan, Tenom region and close to the borders of Kalimantan and Sarawak. Like other ethnic groups in Sabah, the Tagal Murut community are mostly shifting cultivators and hunters. They are renowned for their system of bridewealth payment. Upon marriage, a man pays bridewealth (known as tinauh) for up to twenty years or throughout the life of the marriage. During an expensive and elaborate five-day marriage solemnization celebration the bride's parents will name their desired bridewealth in writing; this is then placed in a basket (cavat) filled with uncooked rice. The cavat is sent to the groom's family by the negotiator (angkuanan). Although the groom's family must fulfil the requests, they can do via the angkuanan and negotiate to substitute the items to the discretion of the angkuanan. During the wedding, the anggalang and magunatip dances are performed. The former is a graceful dance highlighting gentle hand movements, while the magunatip is a pulsating bamboo dance where skilful dancers leap in between the clapped bamboos, following the increasingly rapid rhythm. These dances are normally accompanied by music played on six large gongs, twenty-five tagunggak (bamboo idiophones) and a tambor drum.

Gomantong Caves

Gimestone outcrop in the Lower Kinabatangan area, and contains at least nine caves. For centuries, the Gomantong Caves have been renowned for the valuable edible birds' nests made by two of the four species of swiftlets that roost in the caves. During the harvesting months, visitors may be able to witness the birds' nest collectors in action. This is an age-old tradition and the trade history of birds' nest spans several hundreds of years.

The birds' nests harvesters are individuals who have nerves of steel and skills honed through years of experience. Dangling precariously from the narrow network of ladders is not a task for the faint hearted! It is not surprising that there are only a few experienced individuals who are very much in demand by people and communities that hold the Government's harvesting licenses. Edible birds' nests are protected under the Birds Nest Ordinance and the Forest Enactment. Heavy fines and penalties are imposed on unlicensed collectors.

Generally, two collections are made. The first takes place early in the breeding season before the swiftlets lay their eggs. The birds then make another nest in which they finally lay their eggs. After the young have fledged, the second collection is made. Care must be taken to assure that the nests are collected only after the young swiftlets have abandoned these nests.

Besides observing the exciting display of skill and courage by the birds' nest harvesters, another activity for keen naturalists would be to watch the spectacular display of over 2 million or so resident bats as they spiral out for their evening feed. This usually occurs between 5:15pm and 6:15pm but rain may delay or 'cancel' this spectacular event. As the bats leave, the swiftlets are usually beginning to make their way back to the caves after a day's foraging. The changing of 'shifts' between the bats and birds makes quite a fascinating scene! Look out for the Bat Hawks that linger not far from the scene, as they prey specifically on the bats as they leave their roost.
